ASUMH offers the Cisco Networking Academy as a stand-alone program for individuals

interested in learning networking skills and preparing for the Cisco Certified Network Associate (CCNA) certification exam. The Cisco Networking Academy curriculum covers a broad range of topics, from basic networking skills such as pulling cable to more complex concepts such as applying advanced troubleshooting tools, while working with Cisco's state-of-the-art networking equipment. The program can also serve as the cornerstone of a two-year degree in networking.

In addition, ASUMH also offers the A+ certification program that is an international, vendor-neutral certification recognized

by major vendors, distributors and resellers. The A+ certification confirms a technician's ability to perform computer tasks such as installation, configuration, diagnosing, preventive maintenance, and security.

By incorporating a Computer Information Systems degree along with an industry certification, students can increase their employment potential.

ASUMH is the only two-year college in Arkansas to have a METI-man simulator. This summer, an ambulance simulator was also added in the Health Sciences building.

ASUMH Stream Team Formed

ASUMH has formed a Stream Team thanks to the efforts of Dr. Eddie Dry. The "Hellbenders" will focus on the section of Dodd Creek that runs through campus, and may work on other projects. Arkansas's Stream Team program provides opportunities to become involved in stream and watershed conservation. Efforts revolve around three aspects of conservation: education, advocacy and

stewardship. Coordinated by the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, Stream Teams have monitored water quality on thousands of miles of streams and have picked up tons of litter.
